Impressive...

- The 'gap' in attainment was reduced to 24% from 40% the previous year, with 65% of PP students making 3LOP in English and 52% making 3LOP in Maths- this represents the best ever outcomes for PP students at IVC
- All Y11 leavers had planned destinations, with a 6 with unknown destinations by the end of September 2014. We are focusing this year on improving our tracking of these students post-16, and ensuring students have a clear pathway after results day.
- Attendance also improved, with an increase in overall attendance by 0.8%, and a reduction in persistent absence by 3.4%, which is much closer to the national average
- Behaviour has also improved; fixed term exclusions fell below national average for the first time in recent years, and we maintained the zero permanent exclusion record.

Improve...

- Continue to reduce gap in attainment year on year, with clearer focus on targeted interventions for all year groups
- Particular focus on Y11, narrowing the gap to below 30% this year
- Through a range of support measures, individualised timetables and effective CEIAG we will ensure that all students avoid becoming NEET and progress to appropriate further education, training or employment
- Continue to reduce persistent absence figure and improve overall attendance
- Continue with our effective systems for supporting students to remain in College, and further reduce the use of FTE.
