Course Title: Resin River Plaque – Course 2 (two parts)

Course Description:

River Plaque - Part 1: You will learn how to prepare the area, prepare your project, calculate the amount of resin needed, weigh/measure out the resin components mix up resin (Glasscast), mix in dyes and shimmer, pour out the resin, and how to remove bubbles. This will allow you take on larger projects.

River Plaque - Part 2: You will learn how to finish off your plaque or how to turn it into 2 coasters. You will learn how to polish the piece, then if you wish to turn it into coasters how to cut them, then how to add a finishing edge and then polish them.

Date & Time:	Two consecutive Thursday evenings, 6.00-8.30pm (29 th February and 7 th March or 21 st and 28 th March)

Tutor Details:

I am a full-time university student studying Natural Sciences and decided to take a year off to do something different. I have been on many resin courses to learn the skills required and have since then been creating various resin projects at home, I have taught others how to use, mix and create resin projects, which they then went off after to create their own projects. I decided it would be rewarding to start teaching about resin to a wider audience so others can enjoy this hobby too.

Course Level:

Open to anyone

Course Aims & Objectives:

The objective and aim is teach students to be able to go and take on their own projects

- To teach the students about the health and safety around using resin
 - How to prepare your area (making sure it is dust free)
 - How to calculate the required resin and how to mix the resin correctly (double potting) and keep bubbles to a minimum
 - How to add colour using resin dyes and shimmer to the resin (including not trying to make up the same colour resin, as it is not really possible to get accurate)
 - How to pour the resin and keep bubbles to a minimum
 - Advising on how long the resin should be left to set and in a dust free area

Progression – After this course, what might you do next?

After the course, the student just needs to pick up their finished piece a week later.

Further courses will be run in the future.

How progress and success will be recorded:

Progress will be monitored through the students ability to complete the tasks of the course, such as:

- Does the student understand the health and safety, and preparation procedures?
- Can the student calculate how much resin is required using the resin formula?
- Does the student understand how to mix the resin accurately and the temperature range to work in?
- Can the student pour the resin and know how to remove bubbles?
- Can the student complete the project?
